The tuition fee in English study programs is 4000 EUR per year. If you study in Czech language, you study for free (B1+ certificate required).

We also offer various scholarships, in overall amount up to 4500 EUR / year.

Pilsen is located in the west of the Czech Republic. It has population of 165,000. It is the 4th biggest city in the Czech Republic. It was founded in 1295 on a confluence of four rivers.
