JUSTUS LIEBIG UNIVERSITY GIESSEN

Justus Liebig University (JLU) offers a wide spectrum of subjects in around 90 study programmes. These range from natural and life science subjects, the social sciences, law, business and economics to the humanities, languages and cultural studies as well as teacher training programmes.

The Bachelor's degree is the first academic degree which students can obtain. The length of the course depends on the programme.

JLU's Master's degree programmes are consecutive, which means they allow you to deepen the knowledge you have gained in a previous degree programme.

JLU offers the following Master's degree programmes:

- Master of Arts (MA) in the humanities, languages and social sciences,
- Master of Science (MSc) in mathematics, the natural sciences and business and economics,
- Master of Education (M.Ed.) in vocational education and training, which qualifies graduates to teach at vocational schools, among other things
